Assisting with Emergency Needs

- Emergency Assistance Program helped 360 working families avoid evictions, foreclosures, utility cut-offs and hunger
- Holiday Basket Project provided food, gifts and funds for 75 area needy families at Thanksgiving and Christmas
- Food drives collected non-perishable food distributed to 100 neighbors in need
- Personal care items for 150 shoe boxes were collected and distributed through United Way's ShoeBox Project

Helping Families Become Economically Independent

- ➤ Building Futures Program trained 55 unemployed area residents in a construction pre-apprenticeship training program with 40 landing jobs and apprenticeships after graduation
- ➤ 30 DC-area youth received advice, counseling and career exploration in health care, hospitality, construction and building maintenance
- Provided 10 DC unemployed individuals with job readiness and financial management training through a pre-apprenticeship program run at Phelps Career High School
- Conducted academic and job readiness assessments for over 400 underemployed and unemployed neighbors with referrals for jobs and training

Supporting the Local Labor Community

- Provided strike preparation training and support for members of CWA, UFCW and the Teamsters
- Promoted the Letter Carriers Food Drive in May which collects thousands of pounds of non- perishable food for area food banks
- Provided lay-off preparation for members of Washington Teacher's Union Local 6
- Provided emergency assistance to over 300 members of area local unions
