President Williams thanked Craig Simpson, Rick Powell and Fred Allen for their hard work on the campaigns and the delegates' expressed their thanks with a big round of applause.

It was moved, seconded, and approved to fill existing board vacancies in this way:

To replace Frannie Olshefski as First Vice-President, Ginno Renne (UFCW 1994); to replace Renne as 3rd Vice-President Sandra Falwell (DCNA) and to replace Falwell as a general board member, Chuck Graham (IBEW 26).

Community Services Agency Report-Director Kathleen McKirchy drew the delegates' attention to the Annual Golf Tournament registration form and encouraged participation in the event which raises funds for the Emergency Assistance Fund. She also discussed the upcoming United Way and Combined Federal campaigns and the importance of enhancing funds designated to CSA from union members through these campaigns.

Reports of Delegates and Constituency Groups:

Merle Cuttitta, SEIU 500, reported that they had another court decision upholding their election victory with 400 workers at the National Children's Center and won an additional election for workers in Elkton, MD.

Saul Schniderman, AFSCME Council 26, reported that there in another election coming up for workers at the US Architect of the Capitol and if they win, over 1000 workers will be AF-SCME Council 26 members in the legislative branch of the US government.

Fred Allen, IBT GCC 538C reported that the DC Democratic State Committee will be holding a Unity Breakfast October 4 at the Embassy Suites Hotel and, since the MWC AFL-CIO is a cosponsor, all are encouraged to attend.

Ilana Lipsett, DC Employment Justice Center, announced the availability of a primer on the new Living Wage Law in DC and handed out a flyer aimed at returning DCPS workers to make sure they new what their new hourly wage should be under the law.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 7:55P.
