introduced Mike Cavanaugh from the AFL-CIO who reported that "With so much on the line in this election, the numbers we're seeing for Obama among union members right now not good enough to win" and urged delegates to volunteer for the AFL-CIO phonebank.

OPEIU 2: Eric Starin: WMATA negotiations not going well; have demanded arbitration; Eric also has been canvassing in Northern VA and agrees with Cavanaugh's comments; introduced Bruce Wolf, Chair of OPEIU 2 Social Justice Committee, which is organizing a 11/15 concert by Ann Feeney/Charlie King to benefit CSA's Emergency Assistance Fund.
