Executive Director Kathleen McKirchy reported:

President Williams reported:

Labor FilmFest Report: Another successful year! We had 46 different screenings this year. Over 2,000 people turned out, including 1,000 at the main AFI FilmFest, many of them first-time Film-Fest attendees. We also signed up hundreds for UNION CITY. We also had monthly screenings at venues including the AFL-CIO, AFT, DOL, NLC, SEIU, E Street Cinema, DC EJC, IBEW & AFI. We are working

#### **COPE**

Political Coordinator Rick Powell reported:

Northern Virginia Labor 2008: Walks are going well. The last two Saturdays over 200 showed up, including members of the Metro Council Executive Board. Folks walked out of Annandale, Manassas and Herndon. I worked in Virginia in 1996, 2000, and 2004 and have never seen this much participation; I am confident we will win. Assistant Political Coordinator Alya Mbamba will be contacting people about walks and GOTV efforts. Phonebanking also continues at the AFL-CIO. President Williams reported that he is really pleased about the Affiliate participation, including from the Laborers, UFCW (in Pennsylvania and Virginia), the Washington Building and Construction Trades Council, SEIU (in Ohio and Virginia), UNITE HERE and other locals. Many of the participants are from DC and Maryland. Powell recognized Mbamba for her work in getting participation. Mbamba reported about

the Saturday, October 25 GOTV rally at 9A in Annandale, VA. Thank you for sending out people and make sure you tell us what people are doing so we can recognize them at this year's Evening with Labor Awards dinner. People who cannot participate in walks can phonebank in Annandale, Herndon and the AFL-CIO. Vance Ayres, WBCTC, reported that precincts walks are happening in Northern Virginia every day through the election. Anthony Frederick, Laborers 657, also reminded that phonebanking is happening at their office every weeknight. Mbamba recognized SEIU 722 who sent its entire Executive Board to the AFL-CIO to do phonebanking; just another example of what can be done. We are also looking for people on Election Day and want to make sure that people receive credit for their work. A sign-up sheet is in the back.

- Tri-County COPE: Powell reported that progress is being made on getting a prevailing wage bill passed in Charles County.
- Prince George's COPE
  - East Campus Project: Powell reported that progress is being made on the East Campus project. The project is being scaled back. A coalition of unions and community organizations are working on it
  - Labor Contribution Boycott of Prince George's elected officials: Powell re-

ported that it is still ongoing, but there needs to be an exit strategy for this. We are going to set up a meeting with Prince George's County State Delegates to try to come to a resolution. Lengthy discussion ensued.

## Reports from Board members:

- Linda Bridges, OPEIU 2: The Sheet Metal Workers International Union just laid off our entire bargaining board of workers represented by Local 2 at its pension third party administrators. They did the same thing in 1993 and outsourced many of the jobs. They are also refusing to recognize Local 2. Asked President Williams to send a letter to the Sheet Metal Workers to not fire the workers and to recognize the contract. President Williams asked the Board for approval to send the letter; seconded and approved by the Board.
- Anthony Frederick, Laborers 657: Reported that the Laborers have access to a parking lot near the AFL-CIO that could be used for parking for future E-Board, Delegate meetings. Will find out more info and pass it along.
